1. Notice of Early Closure - Tuesday 4 March

Please be reminded that the school will close early for students tomorrow at 1:25 pm to accommodate Year 10 Parents' Evening. As Year 10 is a particularly large year group, the event will start earlier to allow more parents to book appointments with their child's subject teachers and to give staff time to prepare.

Anita's Buses and ACME Route A will collect their students at the earlier time of 13:30. All other ACME bus routes will collect at the normal time. Anyone else who receives transport via taxis or smaller minibuses should have been contacted directly by those companies with revised collection times.

2. Charity Day: Non-Uniform Day

We have designated **Friday 4 April 2025** as our third Charity Day of the school year and plan to raise funds for the school's chosen charity which for this year is the Animal Rescue Centre in Bishop's Stortford.

The Charity Day will be supported by a student 'non-uniform' day, whereby, they can attend school wearing more casual clothes. As this is a charity event, they are expected to donate of $\pounds 1$ minimum.
