3. Enrichment Week - Payment Deadline Is Today

- If payment is not received, we will presume your child is no longer attending. If you require an extension, you must contact the school.
- We will fund one trip for students eligible for free school meals; any additional trips must be paid for in full in order to participate. Please email Mrs Young at jyoung@birchwoodhigh.org.uk to confirm your child's place. If you have not emailed Mrs Young, your child will not have a confirmed place.
- You will receive an email confirmation before the end of term to confirm your child's place on the trip. If you do not receive this, your child's place is not confirmed. Please email the school if you believe you should have received a confirmation but have not.
- All payments for trips and events are non-refundable unless a replacement can be found.
- For trips to run successfully, the co-operation of students is essential. Continued poor behaviour in school may result in your child being removed from the trip. In this instance, no refund will be offered
- If trips are under-subscribed by the payment deadline, they will be cancelled and you will receive a full refund.
- The bowling trip is still being agreed with the venue and will be confirmed next term.

permission by a teacher to stay in a designated room. For safeguarding reasons, no other areas of the site may be used during lunchtime.
