#### Walkie-Talkie App Disruptions

We want to make parents aware of an app called TenTen, which a small number of students have been using in school. This walkie-talkie app allows users to broadcast messages through another person's phone speaker, causing disruptions to lessons.

We kindly ask parents to check their child's phone for this app and delete it if found. You can find more details about the app here.

#### **Uniform Notice - Trainers**

We are seeing an increasing number of students arriving at school without the correct uniform, particularly white trainers, which are not in line with our uniform policy. Please support us in ensuring all students adhere to our expectations.

If a student is not wearing the correct uniform without a valid reason, the following steps will be taken:

• 1st occasion: A member of staff will speak to the student and contact home will be made.

- 2nd occasion: The student will receive a detention with their teacher and contact home will be made.
- **3rd occasion:** A Pastoral After-School Detention will be issued, and the Head of Year will decide on the next steps.

The vast majority of students follow the uniform policy correctly, and we appreciate their efforts. Our aim is simply to ensure consistency so that learning time is maximised, and unnecessary conflict is avoided.

If there is a genuine reason why your child cannot wear the correct uniform, please inform their form tutor, who can issue a uniform card where necessary.

#### Vaccinations - 26 February 2025

In line with the National Immunisation Programme, the Community School Aged Immunisation Service offers Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio and Meningococcal ACWY vaccinations to all pupils in Year 9.

The immunisation session is due to take place on **Wednesday 26 February 2025.** Every child in Year 9 will have the opportunity for immunisation on the day and all students will see the nurse who will confirm consent, students without consent will be sent back to lessons.

Please read this letter for further details and ensure you complete the Immunisation Form linked within, as requested.

The electronic link to accept or decline this vaccination is open until 12pm on Wednesday 26 February 2025. If any parents have difficulty accessing the online consent form, please contact the Immunisation Team on 01727 732062. If you do not wish for your child to have the immunisation you need to sign in the 'No consent' box.

Please note 'No response' is not 'No consent'.


